

Year 6 Half-Term Overview

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Reading and Writing:

This term we are studying texts on the topic of 'evolution and inheritance'.

Beetle Boy - M.G Leonard

Can We Save the Tiger? - Martin Jenkins

Pupils will learn to write clearly and formally using grammar tools like clauses, adverbials, and cohesive devices. Our final pieces will be a poem and a persuasive pitch.

Science: Adaptation and Evolution

Students will learn:

1. Variation between individuals and how it affects survival.
 2. Adaptations (physical and behavioral) that make species better suited to their habitats.
 3. How fossils provide evidence of evolution over time.
 4. The role of genetics and inheritance in passing traits from one generation to the next.
- Through discussions, diagrams, and examples from nature, students will understand how species change over time and why biodiversity is important.

Maths: Multiplication, Division, Fractions

We are currently focusing on written methods for **multiplication and both short and long division**. Next, we will move on to fractions, including equivalent fractions, simplifying, and operations with fractions. Alongside this, students will continue with **weekly SATs arithmetic practice** on two afternoons each week and will complete a full **practice paper every Friday** to build **confidence and familiarity** with the test format.

OTHER SUBJECTS

Geography

We are looking at **climate change**, life in extreme habitats such as the rainforest, tundra, and deserts. What adaptations have we made to live with the effects of climate change and how we can reduce the growth of climate change.

Religion & World Views

we're exploring the question: "**Are science and religion in conflict?**"

Students will consider different views and learn how both can shape our understanding of the world.

Spanish

We are learning how to speak, read and write about **pets**. What pets we have, how many and describing the animals.

Computing

We are learning about **Online Safety**. This is an important part of helping children use technology responsibly and stay safe when using the internet. We are focusing on understanding risks, making sensible choices, and knowing what to do if something goes wrong

In music we are looking at music/songs from the first and second world war. Looking at their affects on the public.
